What does it mean to be a puppet in a world that is obsessed with rules? What makes a human human? These are the questions we face as we plunge into the reimagined world of the age-old story of Pinocchio, written and directed by Michael Haverty and Marium Khalid.

This re-telling of the classic story is brought to life for adult audiences with puppetry, dance, video projections, and sensory experiences by three of Atlanta's most risk-taking companies: The Object Group, Sky Creature Productions, and 7 Stages.

Audiences will embark on an immersive live experience through an unexpected world full of magic, treachery and desire. Incorporating all five senses, we invite you to journey with Pinocchio as he discovers the roots of his identity and comes to accept his truth.

This production of Pinocchio has been in the works for over three years. The first chapters of the tale were manifested in a film by Haverty and Khalid, released virtually in December 2021, and provided to ticket holders before each live performance.

The immersive live experience picks up where the film left off, with Pinocchio venturing away from home, into a curious and chaotic world.

Recently, Sky Creature's short film Mazloom has won over 10 awards from film festivals around the world including Best Film, Best Director, Best Actor, and Best Sound Design. Michael Haverty - As Producing Artistic Director of The Object Group, Michael writes, directs, and produces multidisciplinary collaborations, theatrical and cinematic originals and adaptations blending puppetry and film. Michael was Co-Artistic Director at 7 Stages Theatre from 2012-2017. Michael was Artistic Associate at the Center for Puppetry Arts from 2002-2012, writing and directing puppet theatre for adults, teens, and the very young.

At the CPA, Michael was program director of the Xperimental Puppetry Theater program for nine years, supporting and curating the work of emerging puppetry artists. Michael has created new work for the Alliance Theatre, Georgia Aquarium, High Museum of Art, Dad's Garage Theatre, Kennesaw State University, and the Goat Farm Arts Center. BA in Theatre from Sarah Lawrence College, MA from Georgia State University in Creative and Innovative Education. Current PhD student at GSU in Early Childhood Education, with a focus on critical scholarship and transformative pedagogy in the arts.

Marium Khalid is a Pakistani-Kashmiri American writer, director and creator leading her companies SAiAH Arts and Sky Creature Productions to receive over 25 major awards. Her previous work includes TERMINUS, an award winning immersive multi-layered story, and an experiential retelling of Moby Dick, winning her Best Director and Best Show. She received the CREATIVITY AND ARTS IMPACT AWARD from Emory College Center for Creativity & Arts.

Most recently Marium's short film MAZLOOM was awarded Best Director, Best Film, and Best Actress from major film festivals as well as receiving official selections from others including the Atlanta Women's Film Festival and the Los Angeles Women's International Film Festival.

Rachel Wansker is an actor, puppeteer and clown. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Theatre and Performance Studies from Kennesaw State University. Rachel studied Clown and Body Memory at the Accademia dell'Arte in Arezzo Italy. After returning to the USA, Rachel earned her Professional Training Certificate from Dell'Arte International School of Physical Theatre in California.




