About True North

Lee Nowell's play True North first came to 7 Stages as part of our Home Brew Series for works in development in 2020, and has now been developed as a full stage production. This scientific theatrical experience asks audiences to consider the things around them that they can't see, like electromagnetic energy and the way we interact with it, in addition to the ways it may affect our morals, navigation, and communication. This play in three parts uses center staging to immerse the audience in a multifaceted performance with monologues, science experiments, projections, and interaction.

All compasses point to Magnetic North, but Magnetic North is currently moving erratically–averaging 34 to 40 miles per year–and humans feel it. When magnetic fields move erratically, the part of our brain that makes ethical decisions becomes impaired, and our health can be compromised–but there are methods to counteract those effects.

Characterizations of The Noosphere (played by Dorothy Bell-Polk with live music, vocalization and movement) and Magnetic North (via projection merged with live science demos) join relatable everyday Joe (Markell Williams)–whose whole world is turned upside down when he takes part in a study about the human ability to detect Magnetic North and the effects it has on our decisions–and Anne (Priscilla Umphrey), an Indigenous scientist who draws parallels between ancient wisdom and new evidence.

True North is a creative exploration of the forces that interconnect us, and the ways we can accept and work within them to stabilize ourselves internally and create a more just, peaceful world. It is a guidebook, combining the latest scientific research with ancient practices from cultural traditions which enable each of us to ground ourselves in the midst of uncertainty. This project, developed with a scientist who has worked for NASA, illuminates the dedicated work of many scientists from around the world and lends a view of where we now stand, then proposes how we can deal with it.

7 Stages is proud to partner with Wild Cumberland and the Atlanta Science Festival for this immersive experience that brings scientists, artists, and community members together. Inspired by a recent visit to Cumberland Island, renowned artist Dorothy O'Connor designed a visual art installation that set the stage for vital dialogues during Art of Activism: Stewards of the Wild (March 10 at 7 Stages), which carriy through to the world premiere of True North.
